Students pursue their aspirations, investigate problems, collaborate on solutions, and transfer their learning to create performances/products. Our school's design allows students to solve real-world issues sparking creativity and igniting imagination. Each student at our school is exposed to the required subjects. These subjects include English Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Physical Education, Health Education, World Language, and Art. In addition, each student selects a STEAM academy that matches their interests. **STEAM academies include the following:**

Young Explorers Academy

A cohort of passionate students working together to create a better world. The four cornerstone skills in the Young Explorers Academy are:

- Creativity

- Collaboration

While enrolled in this academy, students are charged with finding creative solutions to authentic, real-world problems. 


Opportunities for students include:
